

Maths

Using the Abacus scheme as a basis, children will be working on their separate year groups new National Curriculum. Half-termly tests.

English

Spelling, Punctuation Grammar – daily
Reading – groups and individual daily.
Creative writing – using topic as basis- e.g a commentary on videos, the Firemaker’s Daughter, recount- trip.

Science

Volcanoes- soil, rocks: formation and characteristics
Irreversible changes (burning experiments!) including cooking (hopefully not burning)
