As an author your child will

Take part in daily phonics and spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG) sessions. These will focus on reading, writing and spelling skills.

Linked to our topic, children will also be involved in reading and writing activities enabling them to apply these skills in a meaningful way through extended individual and group tasks.

As a geographer your child will:

Practise their mapping skills - Learn about the four countries and capital cities of the UK using atlases.

Qu: Why is there a dragon on the Welsh flag?

Qu: How can I find out which is the biggest country in the UK?

Qu: In what ways would our lives be different and be the same if we lived in a capital city?

Beebot App is great to help with direction and coding.

As an historian your child will:

Think about their ancestors who lived in the Middle Ages. Qu: What sort of knight would I be if I was a 'Knight of the Round Table?' Qu: What would happen if I could time travel and meet my ancestors in medieval times? BBC Bitesize is a great interactive website to use at home.

As an artist your child will:

Grow their imaginations and develop their creative skills - Creating coats of arms, practising needlework skills, building Chinese dragons to celebrate Chinese New Year
Qu: Are the colours on a coat of arms significant?
Qu: What needlework skills have been uses through history?
Qu: Can I design a Chinese Dragon?
Hobby craft sells lots of sewing kits for children

As a musican your child will:

Compose music for a Chinese dragon dance. Qu: Can we compose music to get our dragons dancing? Charanga is a musical website which you and your child will be able to access online at home – login details to follow.

As a theologian your child will:

Be answering the following questions Qu: Why is Shabbat important to the Jewish community? Qu: Can I explain what is meant by the Holy Trinity? The Usborne Children's bible is a lovely book to share with your child.

Working together:
