Home learning:

Kingfisher geographers will develop geographical knowledge of our wonderful planet Earth by:

Learning focus on physical geography (eg deepest oceans, highest mountains, widest valleys)

Questions to investigate:

- Where are the most extreme parts of our planet?
- Which are the deepest oceans, highest mountains and widest valleys?

As musicians we will compose music inspired by buildings:

- Research composers inspired by architecture eg Karl Jenkins Palladio
- Discover world famous music venues

As historians, we will explore architecture from past and present:

- How and why did people from the past design and build the structures they did?
- How does past architecture help us now?

As scientists we will explore wonderful creatures and their habitats:

- Why is there such a diversity in the animal and plant kingdoms?
