<u>Research and fact collect</u> What is Plastic Pollution?	Read the Plastic Powerpoint. Complete the guided reading activity on Plastic Pollution.
<u>Promote the message</u> What can we do to help?	Design a poster telling people ways that they help reduce the problem <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recycle what you can • When out and about always put litter in the bin – especially when on the beach or by water. • Don't buy plastic bags when out shopping if possible • Use a reusable water bottle • Use metal or paper straws • Remind others if they forget Start to use the '100 pieces of Plastic' recording sheet and colour in a square every time you see a piece of plastic left that you could pick up. *ALWAYS CHECK WITH YOUR GROWN UP BEFORE PICKING UP ANYTHING*
<u>Significant Individual</u> Who is making a difference already?	Read the 'Fantastic like Finlay' Powerpoint with a grown up. Can you find out some facts about him and his goal?
<u>Hands on!</u> How much plastic is in your house?	Can you find some items made of plastic in your house? Can you help sort out what can be recycled?
<u>Reflect</u> In our guided reading activity on Monday one of the facts said that "by 2050 there will be more plastic in the ocean than fish!"	Think: What does this make you feel? Can you think of some adjectives? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sad? • Scared? • Worried? Draw: What might the ocean look like if there was more litter than fish? Write: Can you try and persuade people to use less plastic?
