We will write persuasive adverts linked to our Art and Design project. We will write arguments for and against robots ruling the world and reports in geography, history and science.

As Artists and Designers, we will create:

- A model robot including a moving part and an electrical circuit.
- Why do robots look like they do? How much is artistic design and how much functional use?
- Where can I find inspiration for my art? Nature or man-made objects? (Linked to RE)

Spanish: As linguists we will learn words and phrases and how to write them too through songs games and having short conversations in Spanish.

As Scientists, we will investigate:

- how to make and draw electric circuits
- what mechanical forces at work during forest schools,
- how to see round corners
- what is meant by "states of matter" and why does it matter?

As musicians, we will compose music linked to machines/Industrial Revolution.

Use the Charanga unit: How does music make our World better? Develop our skills on tuned instruments : ukulele, keyboard or guitar.
