<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Talking to our children about current events in Ukraine</u></b></p> <p>Our thoughts and prayers are with those most impacted by the conflict in Ukraine. Although we will answer children's questions in an age appropriate way as they arise, there will be no focus on the violent aspects and imagery of war. Our children have had so much to worry about in their young lives over the last two years. To worry about more world issues, that they have no control over, could be overwhelming. We know you will be discussing the news with them in a way that you feel is appropriate for your own child. At school, we will reassure the children that adults across the world are working together to resolve their differences and over time we will learn more about the humanitarian efforts to support children and families but this will be done at the children's pace.</p> <p>Of course, staff and parents may want to do something now.
