Bitterns RNLi Trip

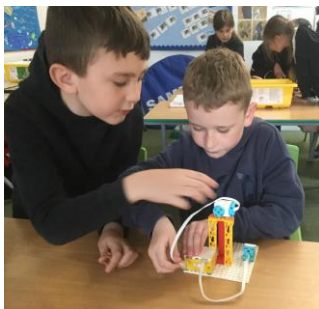
