Welcome Day

Friday 16th June saw the whole school join together in their house colours and combine "Empathy Day" with "Welcome Day".

"Welcome Day" raises awareness of the plight of refugees and asylum seekers and Welcome Wheels is a charity that provides refurbished second-hand bicycles, helmets, locks, lights and cycle training, to newly resettled refugees and asylum seekers in Norwich.

We raised £37.00 for this amazing cause - one which we weren't aware of before last week.

During the morning, the children spent time listening to stories that allowed them to reflect on their own lives and those of others. How can they help others who are in need? What do we all take for granted?

They spent time in their House colours with their House Captains and visited each class teacher to experience a different story and activity.

In the afternoon the children painted stones to brighten up their welcome sign, they made paper bags that homeless people make in India to earn money and they sat around a camp fire and imagined life without houses and ovens. Shelters were also built in their groups and the children thought about life in refugee camps and existing without enough food and warmth.
