Free School Meals

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Registering for free meals could also raise an extra £1320 per child for the school. This additional funding can be used to fund valuable support like interventions, additional teaching and support staff, training or resources.

This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed below.

Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
