Salhouse are planning a World Book Week beginning March 4th!

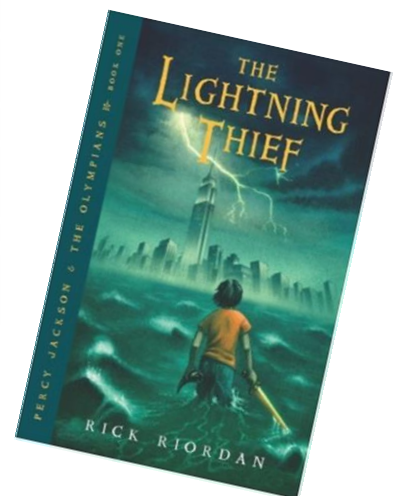
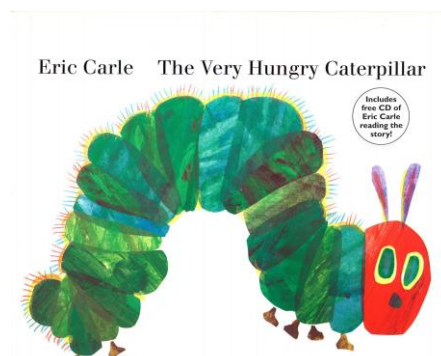
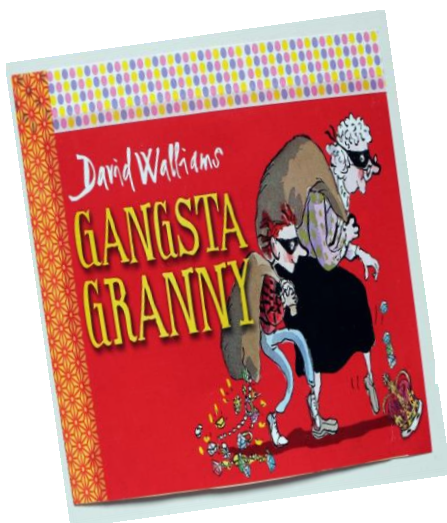
