Our big questions this term are:

Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?

What is philosophy?



Science

Using the book 'Street beneath my feet' , we will learn about the types of rocks, their properties and where we would find them.

Linking to 'Wonders of the World' We will explore the parts of the plant and their function in supporting the life of the plant. We will explore how these vary from plant to plant by learning about some of the most wonderful plants!



History

We will use sources of information to learn about the Ancient Greeks; their contributions to philosophy, maths, astronomy and medicine. We will also explore aspects of their architecture and the Greek myths.



Geography

Why do people live near volcanoes?

Children learn that the Earth is constructed in layers, and the crust is divided into tectonic plates. They study the formation and distribution of mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes and use Mount Etna to identify how human interaction shapes a volcanic landscape.

Wonders of the World

I.T.

Through our work on coding, children will learn that programs respond to different sorts or inputs and the keyboard can be used to control objects on the screen.

They will design and improve their own programs.



Music

Building on what we learnt about notation last term, we will be using our imagination to create compositions. We will link these to our work in Geography.

RSHE

Children will be talking about their heritage.

They will also explore how our feelings can influence the way we behave. Children will name different emotions, talk about how these feel and how o manage negative behaviours.

Art

Kingfishers will be exploring a wide range of sculpture this term. We will be visiting the Sainsbury's Centre of Visual Art, where we will see sculptures by a range of artist such as Henry Moore, Vladimir Tatlin and John Davies. We will be using these pieces of art work, as well as taking inspiration from a range of Greek Myths to create our own sculptures in a range of mediums.



D & T

This term we will be learning about levers and pulleys. We will explore their application as we **design- make** and **evaluate** our own marble labyrinth inspired by the Greek Myth Theseus and the Minotaur.



French

We will continue to develop our pronunciation whilst learning vocabulary linked to our skills and fruits. We will build our conversational skills by talking about these in French!
